My Philosophy

Classroom Rules

Homework Policy/Assessment Policy

The expectation is that students will finish any assessments at home that were not complete in class to demonstrate understanding. Grading in the classroom will be based on student ability to give their **best effort while learning**. The student must demonstrate effort to understand and this will generate a **continuously evolving grade**.

Rewards & Consequences

Students will receive tickets that they can put into a jar based off of the following of our classroom rules. This will be **HOMERUN** expectations. When students are unable to we will follow a 3-strike rule that leads to a temporary dugout removal. My goal is always to have student rejoin learn with a **clean slate**.
